## What is Savorism in Volunteering?

- refers to a pattern of viewing people in nonwhite communities as in need of "rescuing".
- (White) Savorism- BIPOC people are denied agency and are seen as passive recipients of white benevolence.

*"They* will be so grateful."

*"You're* changing a life."

After MAVA

- Change language
